Ireland at Venice Sean Lynch, Adventure: Capital The Irish Tour

21 January - 24 March 2016

Limerick City Gallery of Art is pleased to present The Irish Tour of *Adventure: Capital*, a new artwork by artist Sean Lynch that was commissioned for Ireland at Venice 2015, the Irish Pavilion at the 56th International Art Exhibition – La Biennale di Venezia. Visited by over 400,000 people during the world's most prestigious visual arts exhibition, *Adventure: Capital* now begins its national tour of Ireland.

Adventure: Capital is Sean Lynch's most ambitious project to date and traces a journey from myth to minimalism around Ireland and Britain, combining Greek river gods; public art at regional airports; quarries and the art of stone-carving; an abandoned sculpture in Cork; and a traffic roundabout, on a storytelling journey that unravels notions of value and the flow of capital through an anthropological lens.

Alongside Adventure: Capital at Limerick City Gallery of Art, Sean Lynch will present a selection of previous artworks, including A Church Without A Steeple (2012, Arts Council Collection), A Rocky Road (2011), Peregrine Falcons Visit Moyross (2008), Bill Clinton (2007), and Latoon (2006–2015). Subsequent presentations of Adventure: Capital in Sligo, Dublin and Belfast will also be individually configured with existing and new artworks, giving audiences multifaceted perspectives on Lynch's practice.

The exhibition is accompanied by the *Adventure: Capital* exhibition publication, freely available with an essay by the curator Woodrow Kernohan and additional texts by Sean Lynch and Michele Horrigan.

Sean Lynch (b. Kerry, Ireland, 1978) lives and works in Askeaton, Limerick, Ireland. He studied at the Städelschule, Frankfurt am Main and Limerick School of Art and Design, LIT. Recent solo exhibitions include: Ronchini Gallery, London (2015); Lismore Castle Arts (2015); Modern Art Oxford (2014); VISUAL, Carlow (2014); Dublin City Gallery the Hugh Lane (2013); The Model, Sligo (2012); Crawford Art Gallery, Cork (2011–12). Selected group exhibitions include: CAPC, Musée d'Art Contemporain de Bordeaux (2015); Charles H. Scott Gallery, Vancouver (2013); IMMA | Irish Museum of Modern Art, Dublin (2011); Camden Arts Centre, London (2010); neugerriemschneider, Berlin (2010). He was awarded the TrAIN International Artist Residency at Gasworks, London (2012) and since 2006 has co-organised the residency and exhibition programme Askeaton Contemporary Arts in County Limerick. Lynch is represented by Kevin Kavanagh Gallery, Dublin and Ronchini Gallery, London, and is author and editor of many artist publications and bookworks. A man walks to his workplace. His route is not straightforward. He must walk around buildings, through streets and into many rooms to get to where he's going. It agitates him, makes him uncomfortable – why was this place planned this way? He always thought the principals of today's buildings suggested otherwise. Could there ever be a rational plan where he could stroll straight to his destiny? Only a donkey would zigzag.

One day, he takes a coin from his pocket, holds it out in his hand, and begins to use it to scratch a mark into the wall. As he walks, the scratch continues. The next day he does the same, and the day after. He hopes these marks will build and build, and one day cause the building to collapse into rubble.
